## Lake Shore Project Permit Information

(Pertinent to typical landowner projects)

## Wetland Conservation Act (WCA):

Any fill to be placed in a wetland, and especially near lakes, rivers, etc, is regulated. Contact the Itasca County Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) if you are considering filling any area/s that you think may be designated wetlands; 218-328-3099.

#### "Shoreland Alterations Permit":

- \* Shoreland projects that involve more than 10 cubic yards of fill (approximately one standard sized dump truck load) being added above the "Ordinary High Water" mark OHW (essentially against and/or above the bank).
  - and/or -
- \* The movement of more than 10 cubic yards within the shore impact zone (half the building setback).

   and/or -
- \* The movement of more than 50 cubic yards within 1000 feet of the lake.
- One page application can be obtained from the "Environmental Services" office (Zoning), in the Itasca Co courthouse, at 123 4th St NE-Grand Rapids (on hwys 169 and 2, centrally in town) 218-327-2857.
- Applications can be filed any time during the growing season-spring, summer or fall, and a site visit will
  be done shortly thereafter to review the application (applications aren't reviewed during the winter).
- \$80 fee.

## MN DNR "General Waters Permit":

Shoreline projects below the "Ordinary High Water" mark-OHW (essentially against and/or below the bank), which involve any of the following: bank shaping, excavation in lake bottom, any off site dirt fill being added, or rock fill added more than six feet out from the bank, into the water.

- Fee typically starts at \$150.00.
- Apply at www.mndnr.gov/mpurs; contact for questions: Rian Reed, NE MN DNR Area Hydrologist -1201 E Hwy 2 in Grand Rapids - 218-328-8815.
- Applications can be filed year around, but should be filed at least one month prior to construction.
   \*Note: if any aquatic vegetation will be removed, a MN DNR Fisheries permit may also be required.

Army Corps of Engineers "General Permit":

Shoreline projects below the "Ordinary High Water" mark-OHW (against and/or below the bank), where "more than 50 feet of existing bank is disturbed by grading or reshaping".

- Free permit.
- Apply with:

- Permit can be filed year around, but file the permit at least two months before construction is scheduled.
